

BIG NEWS

February meeting will be held at **Western Sizzlin Steak House** in N. Little Rock

The Arkansas Corvair Club will meet on Tuesday, **February 19**, at the **Western Sizzlin Steak House restaurant**, at 5306 JFK Boulevard, in North Little Rock. The restaurant is one block north of the intersection of McCain Blvd. and JFK Blvd.

The restaurant is very easy to find. If coming from I-30 south or I-40, take the Highway 107 exits (Exits 153A or 153B) and proceed north on JFK Blvd. (Highway 107). You can also take the McCain Blvd. Exit, from Highway 67/167 and proceed west on McCain Blvd. Then north (right) on JFK Blvd. The restaurant is easy to see and has plenty of parking.

We are moving our meeting location because the Bonanza Family Restaurant, which had been our meeting site for two years, closed permanently last November.

This will be our club's first *official* meeting of 2002 and our first meeting at this new location. Based on our February meeting experience, we'll decide whether to name the Western Sizzlin Steak House as our new permanent meeting location, or to continue searching for an acceptable site.

We look forward to seeing you on Tuesday, **February 19**, at the Western Sizzlin Steak House restaurant, on JFK Boulevard, N. Little Rock, for our first formal and official meeting of this year 2002. We will be discussing plans for 2002 activities and our upcoming election of club officers. ■

If we go forward with our Hot Springs plans for spring, we're looking at the weekend of May 10-12.

ACC members enjoyed a fun evening at the Holiday Open House party hosted by Stew and Ronnie MacLeod, on January 19. Our thanks to Stew and Ronnie for another terrific event and their years of dedicated support for the Arkansas Corvair Club.

The only weekend available for our spring gathering at the Hamilton Inn Resort, in Hot Springs, is May 10-11. I'm hopeful this date will work, since nothing else is available for late April or off-season.

Our Arkansas Corvair Club needs *your* financial support

Paying your membership dues, **every year**, is critical to our club's financial well-being...

Without unnecessarily alarming you, we want to share the news about some financial stress that our Arkansas Corvair Club is experiencing in 2002.

Our biggest regular expense is the cost of printing and mailing our monthly newsletter. That fixed cost consumes *most* or nearly *all* of your annual membership dues.

We work hard to produce a quality newsletter for you and we hope you enjoy the newsletter and that it serves to keep you informed about your fellow local Corvair enthusiasts and Corvair-related activities in Arkansas and our region.

However, our cost of producing and mailing the newsletter continues to increase. We're facing a first class postage increase in coming weeks and our printing cost has **more than doubled**, since last October. The increased printing cost is related to the fact that we lost a vendor who provided quality work at a discounted price.

What this means to *all* of us is that we need to re-evaluate how we produce and distribute our monthly newsletter to determine if we have any workable options for reducing our cost.

Also, it means that if you don't support us financially by paying your annual dues and keeping them current, we cannot afford to mail to you. We must drop you from our mailing list and membership rolls.

As you might imagine, we do not want to lose any members. We need your support and we appreciate the support you've given over the years.

Therefore, we are asking those of you whose membership dues have lapsed or who have been slow to pay in recent years to lend you support this year, and going forward, to keep **your** Arkansas Corvair Club strong and solvent.

In addition to our usual *Dues Alert* feature (below), in this newsletter we're publishing names of members whose dues have lapsed. We
